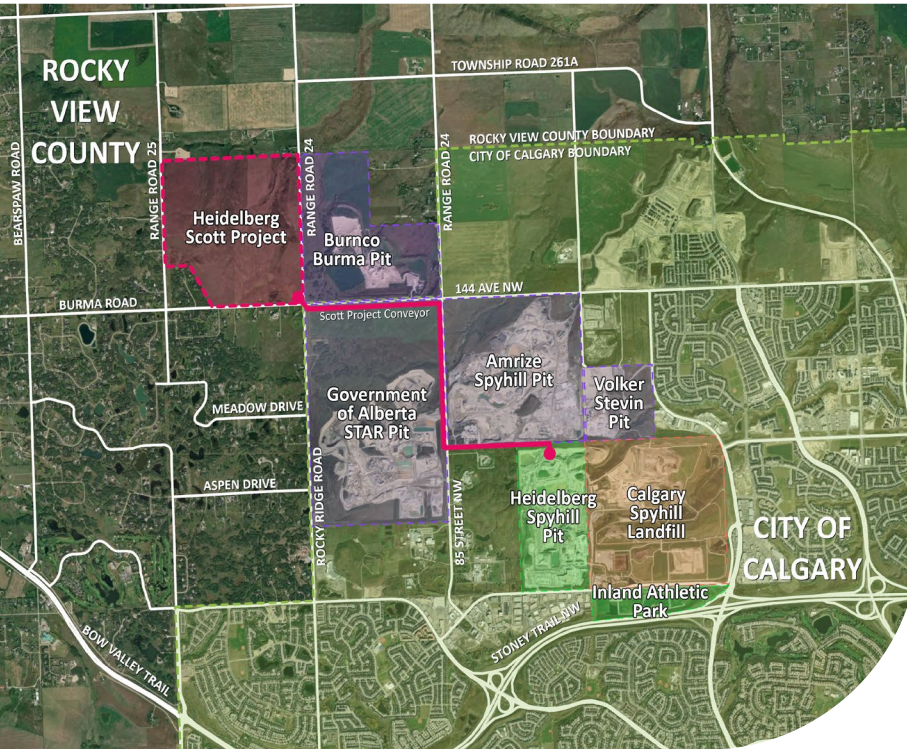


Scott Project Update

Overview of the Project

Located north of Burma Road west of Calgary's Spy Hill area, the Scott Project is a proposed sand and gravel pit with an estimated 50 million saleable tonnes. The design includes a 4.5 km conveyor to reduce haul traffic related impacts with most processing occurring off-site at the existing Spy Hill facility.

The Project aims to supply high-quality aggregates to support regional infrastructure and housing needs. It is currently undergoing technical assessments and will be reviewed by the Natural Resources Conservation Board (NRCB). Heidelberg is committed to responsible development, environmental stewardship, and ongoing community engagement. Updates will be shared regularly as the project progresses.

Summer 2026: Project planning and technical studies are continuing through summer 2026. Feedback received through the open houses and one-on-one engagement is helping refine Project design, operational plans, mitigation measures, and the final regulatory application.

A geotechnical investigation is planned for August, at the intersections of Burma Road / Rocky Ridge Road, as well as 85th St. / 127 Ave.
